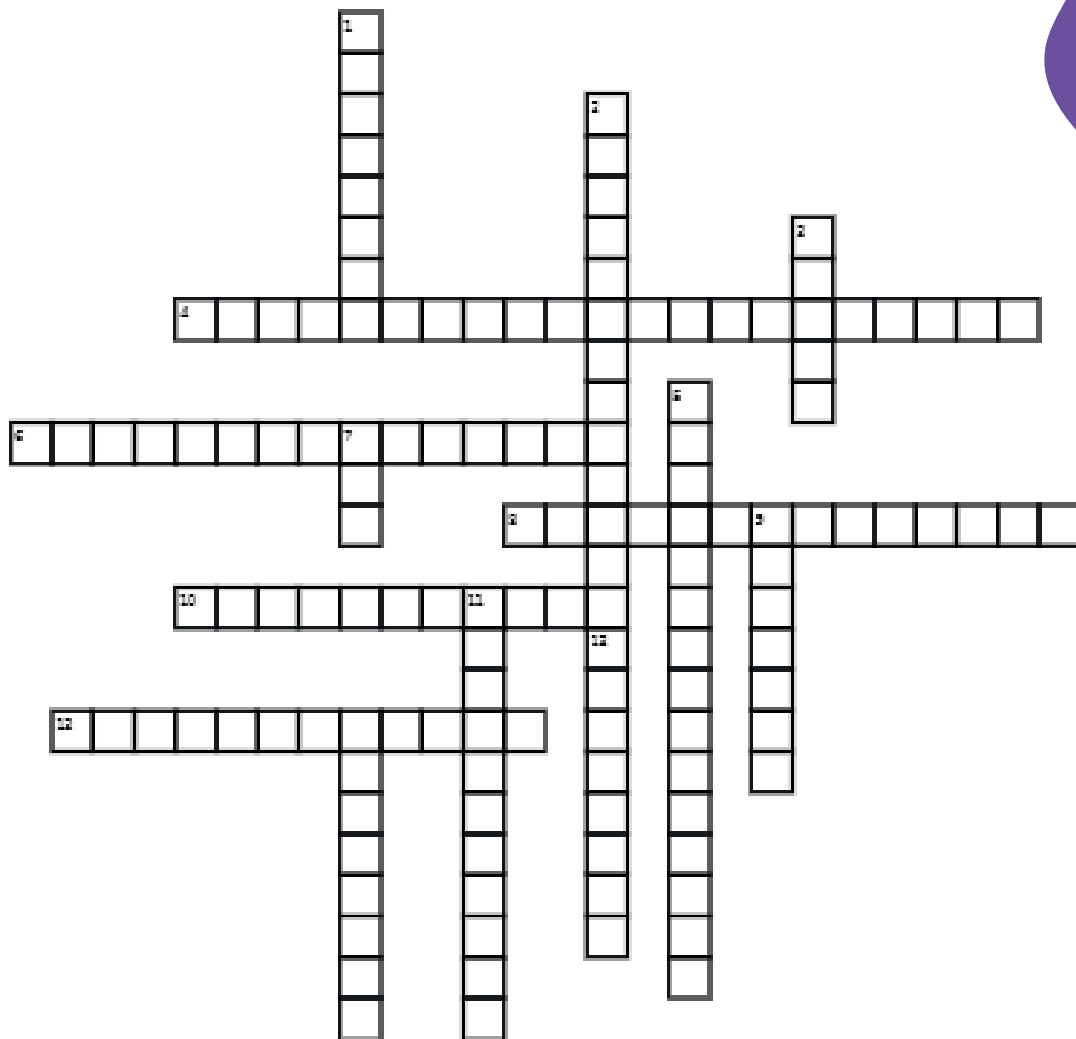


CROSSWORD
